Needs Based:

International Peace Scholarship

The International Peace Scholarship program is committed to promoting a student body made up of diverse nationalities and cultural backgrounds, which in the future will contribute to a worldwide medical community. Partial scholarships are awarded to non-US students who exhibit academic excellence, demonstrate financial need, and who will return to their home countries as physicians dedicated to the enhancement of the countries' medical care systems. These awards are grants-in-aid and do not have to be repaid.

Global Medicine Scholarship

The Global Medicine Scholarship program is committed to promoting a student body made up of diverse nationalities and cultural backgrounds specifically within the Keith B. Taylor Global Scholars Program, which in the future will contribute to a worldwide medical community. Partial scholarships are awarded to non-US students who exhibit academic excellence, demonstrate financial need, and who will return to their home countries as physicians dedicated to the enhancement of the countries' medical care systems. These awards are grants-in-aid and do not have to be repaid.

Graduate Studies Scholarship

Partial Scholarships are awarded to students as they enter a graduate degree program. These awards are grants and do not have to be repaid.

SELECTION PROCESS

Selection of award recipients is made by the Office of Financial Aid Services in accordance with guidelines set by the University's Financial Aid Committee. Applicants should be aware that the funding is limited and the quality of the applicants is generally very competitive. Unfortunately, awards cannot be made to every deserving student. Award determinations are based upon **demonstrated academic excellence, the degree of financial need and availability of funds from the University to meet that need, the student's ability to finance his/her complete education beyond the extent of the financial aid, the student's commitment to enhancing care in the country in which they intend to practice** (*Please use a separate sheet of paper for your 250 word essay*)

AMOUNTS & USES OF INSTITUTIONAL AID

Partial tuition scholarships are granted to members of each entering class to the School of Medicine, School of Veterinary Medicine, and Graduate Studies Programs. Awards for the full cost of attendance are not offered. In order for the student to plan in advance for the financial obligations associated with attending St. George's, all awards are made prior to the student's matriculation in the School of Medicine, School of Veterinary Medicine or Graduate Studies Program. Students entering the Pre-professional Program may apply and receive a determination regarding an award to allow incorporation of the award in their financial planning.

These applications for institutional aid are not accepted from upperclassmen. All awards must be used to defray the cost of tuition and are credited directly to the students account each term by the Office of Student Finances. Awards are made for the entire curriculum and pro rated on the term/academic year schedule. The award letter will outline the distribution of the award.

APPLICATION DEADLINES & AWARD NOTIFICATION

Applications will be accepted from either applicants or accepted students. All funds allocated for the entering classes are awarded at that time. Applicants will receive either an award letter or a letter of declination from Financial Aid Services in a timely manner.

**DEADLINES: December 1 for class commencing in January
July 1 for class commencing in August**

Late applications will be reviewed up to the day of registration for students with extenuating circumstances, including being accepted to the University after the scholarship deadline. In addition to the application instructions listed below, the applicant must include a letter outlining the reason for submitting a late scholarship application. **No application will be accepted later than the first day of classes in the School of Medicine, School of Veterinary Medicine or Graduate Studies Program.**

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete **all** questions that apply to you and your family on the Family Needs Analysis. Even independent and older students must supply information and documentation about their families. **Convert all currency figures into US dollars before entering them on the form.**
2. Documentation of the facts presented in this application must be submitted before or with this application. Required documentation: Earnings statements and/or wage slips, income and asset statements from banks, prior year tax returns. A solid financial plan detailing how the applicant intends to finance their complete education, inclusive of living and travel, will be required as part of the review process.
3. Prepare 250-word essay on separate sheet of paper describing your goals as a professional in the country in which you intend to practice to be included with application.
